So How Do You Frame Needlework?

You've put so much time and effort into creating a beautiful piece of needlework art, now you want to be sure it is framed properly. This is one of the things we are known for, framing needlework with great care and skill to be certain it will be preserved for many years.



First we work with you to select matting and framing materials that will both enhance the appearance of your needlework and protect it from environmental damage. We'll discuss the advantages of different types of glazing such as glass, acrylic, and Museum Glass.

When we begin assembling your piece of art we will stretch the needlework to an acid free foam core board and attach it with pins into the foam center of the board. Next we will add the acid free mat and the glass you selected and place it in the frame held in with framing points.



Finally we will enclose the back with a paper dustcover, attach wire for hanging and add a picture hanger to use when you hang it.

As you may have read in the article above, the "stretching" of needlework keeps it in place and nicely displayed by smoothing it down and pinning it to the acid free board used for stretching. When stretched the needlework is ready to go in the frame, with or without mat.

When finished with you choice of mat and glazing the needlework looks its best and is ready to hang and enjoy.
